Business 'Energy' ideas:

Energy use at Goosemoor Organics is monitored using a smart meter. The company is looking at "intelligent" electrical fittings which will automatically turn off equipment when not needed.

Ecotricity, a renewable energy supplier, supplies Shamrock Veterinary Clinic's electricity - 100% is from wind power.

The Nidd Vale Group installed a computerised energy system at two sites to efficiently control their showroom and workshop heating. There is a potential for 20% savings and their Hornbeam Park site has cut gas consumption by almost 10%.

The Green House and Treves UK both won Outstanding Achievement Awards for Energy in the BAFTERS 2005.

Goosemoor Organics have put in place a range of measures to save energy, including installing a small wind turbine and a solar panel, which reduce energy costs and carbon emissions. The offices are double insulated to maximise energy efficiency.

Both Goosemoor Organics and The Green House have chosen 'green energy' tariffs from their energy suppliers. The companies who supply this energy have committed themselves to obtaining it from renewable sources.

Treves UK has installed automatic light switches in some areas to reduce energy use and Goosemoor Organics use energy saving light bulbs. Goosemoor also have skylights to let in natural light and reduce the need for electrical lighting.
