Sir

Yet again the long suffering residents of Kirby Hill find themselves under threat from developers wishing to destroy our village and rural landscape.

As has been decided by three earlier planning applications there is no case for a MSA at Kirby Hill. There are, or will be MSA's at Leeming Bar and Wetherby, making Kirby Hill wholly unnecessary.

The developers plans take out of production 43 acres of prime agricultural land at a time when this is needed to maximise our food production given that BREXIT will increase the cost of food imports and put food security at risk. We also need to grow our food as close to its consumption as possible to help reduce carbon emissions.

The visual impact of the scheme will destroy the rural nature of Kirby Hill and the light pollution will badly impinge on the village and on stargazing.

The additional traffic created by staff going to and leaving the site together with delivery vehicles would put an unacceptable level of stress on the local road network, creating pollution and safety issues.

This development is not wanted, not needed and would cause untold harm to the environment and to the local landscape. We earnestly request that you refuse planning consent for the reasons outlined above.
